Reflection

- British mathematician Alan Turing (1912 1954): Turing test
- Today machines pass the Turing test
- Machines can beat humans with artificial intelligence
- There is even debate on artificial consciousness.
- What does this mean for humans? Are machines the better humans?

Psalm 8:

"you have put all things under his feet, all sheep and oxen, and also the beasts of the field, the birds of the heavens, and the fish of the sea, whatever passes along the paths of the seas."

- Where do machines fit in in this sequence?
- Machines which can be more powerful than humans?
- What does make us human?

It is not our mind, our physical strength, our mental capacity, our consciousness, it is nothing we own or have – because there are humans who lack whatever we use to define our humanity. But it is us being created in God's image – or as Psalm 8 puts it: that we are in Gods mind and God cares for us.

What is man that you are mindful of him, and the son of man that you care for him?
